A MUST-SEE MONUMENT IN CAEN...

The Abbaye-aux-Hommes (Men's Abbey) is an architectural masterpiece of medieval art, but also of the 18th century. The monastery was built in the 11th century, then rebuilt in the 18th century, and now houses Caen City Hall. Take the time to enjoy a stroll through the majestic cloister and to discover exhibitions retracing the history of the site.



This year, Caen is celebrating 1,000 years of history with over 250 events showcasing its rich heritage, its artistic and scientific culture, and projecting it into the future.

Exceptional exhibitions, lectures and guided tours are being held at the Abbaye-aux-Hommes.

The Church of Saint-Étienne, the former abbey church of the Abbaye-aux-Hommes, is still used for worship but is now separate from the former monastery. It is open to visitors free of charge Monday to Friday from 9am to 6pm, Saturday from 10am to 6pm and Sunday from 2pm to 6pm, except during religious services and ceremonies.

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Self-guided tours

DISCOVERY TOUR (without quide)

All year round, explore the cloister, the calefactory, the scriptorium, the Great Staircase and the gatehouse at your own pace.

The gatehouse and the calefactory have **permanent exhibition** spaces: «Caen, un été 44, la vie continue» (Caen, in the summer of 44, life goes on), with its section on the Liberation of Caen, and «Les mondes normands, 1066-1204» (The worlds of Normandy, 1066-1204). The scriptorium regularly hosts **temporary exhibitions**, which you can also enjoy during your visit.
